Wellesbourne SNT staff – Insp Ben Hembry, PS James Evans, PC Chris Taylor, PCSO Liam Allen and PCSO Sarah BAILEY (to return in April).

- SNT staff are not usually the officers who will respond to any 999 calls or more urgent 101 calls for service. These are still responded to by the nearest available unit and more often Patrol officers based at Stratford Police station.
- The Wellesbourne SNT staff have moved parade base from Stratford to Southam. This decision has been made for a number of reasons but will not effect or impact their ability to serve your community. They will not be delayed responding to incidents as it is not usually them who respond!
- The Wellesbourne team currently utilise the generous support of the fire service to allow use of the fire station and this will continue, therefore the presence of the team and their visibility will remain.
- We are regularly reviewing our activity and trying to develop new initiatives to make us more visible in the community and hope you will like the launch and delivery of our new 5x5x5 Targeted patrol. Please feel free to engage with us when out and about!

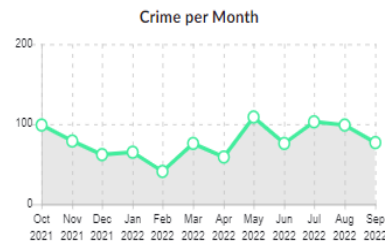

Current SNT Priorities and Actions (for entire beat area):

1. ASB Patrols

Action- Visible patrols both in vehicle and on foot, gathering intel and engaging with perpetrators.

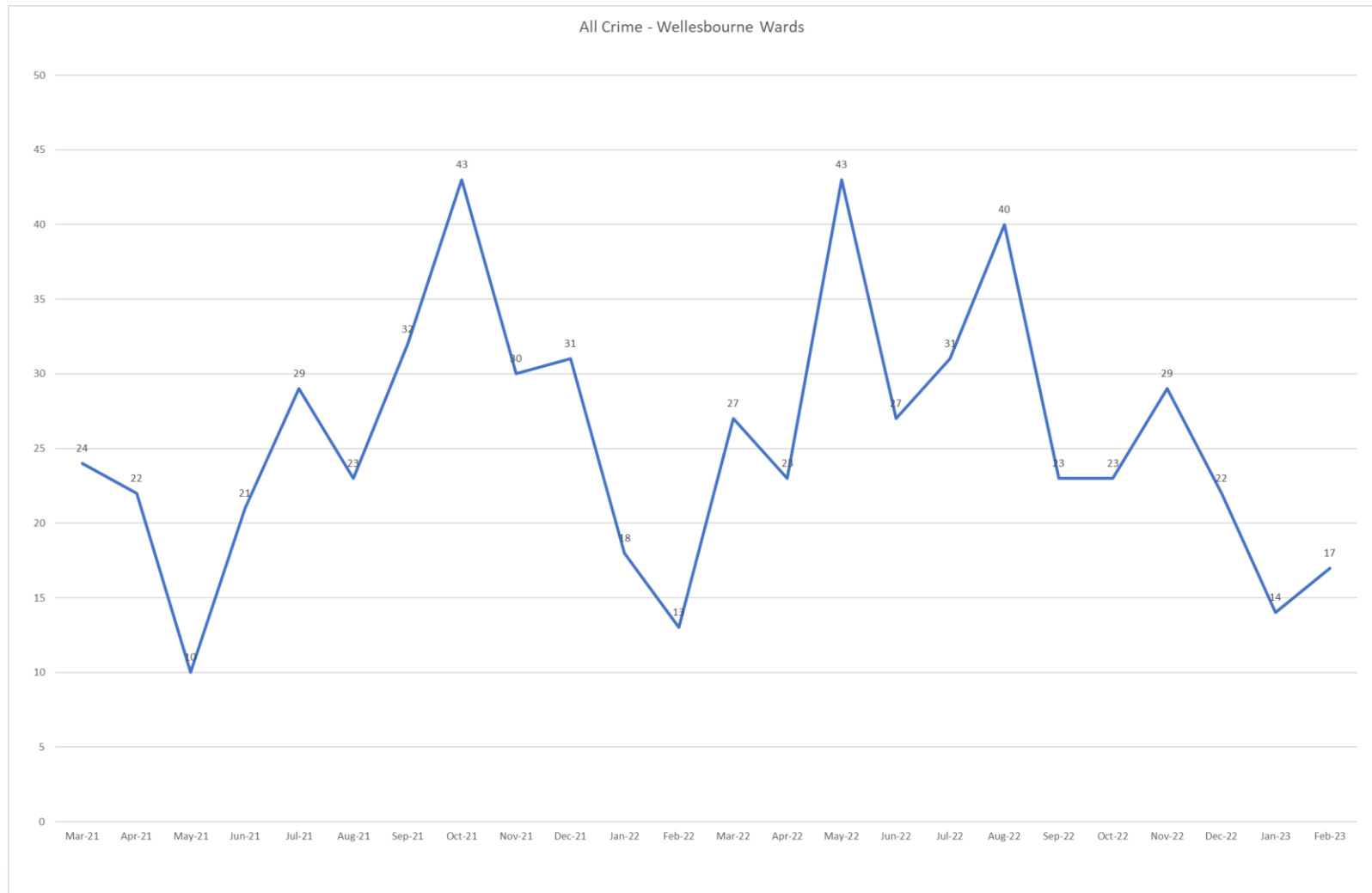
2. Speeding

Action – speed checks conducted by the SNT, Road Safety Unit deploy the camera vans regularly, and we continue to support the Wellesbourne Community Speed Watch group.

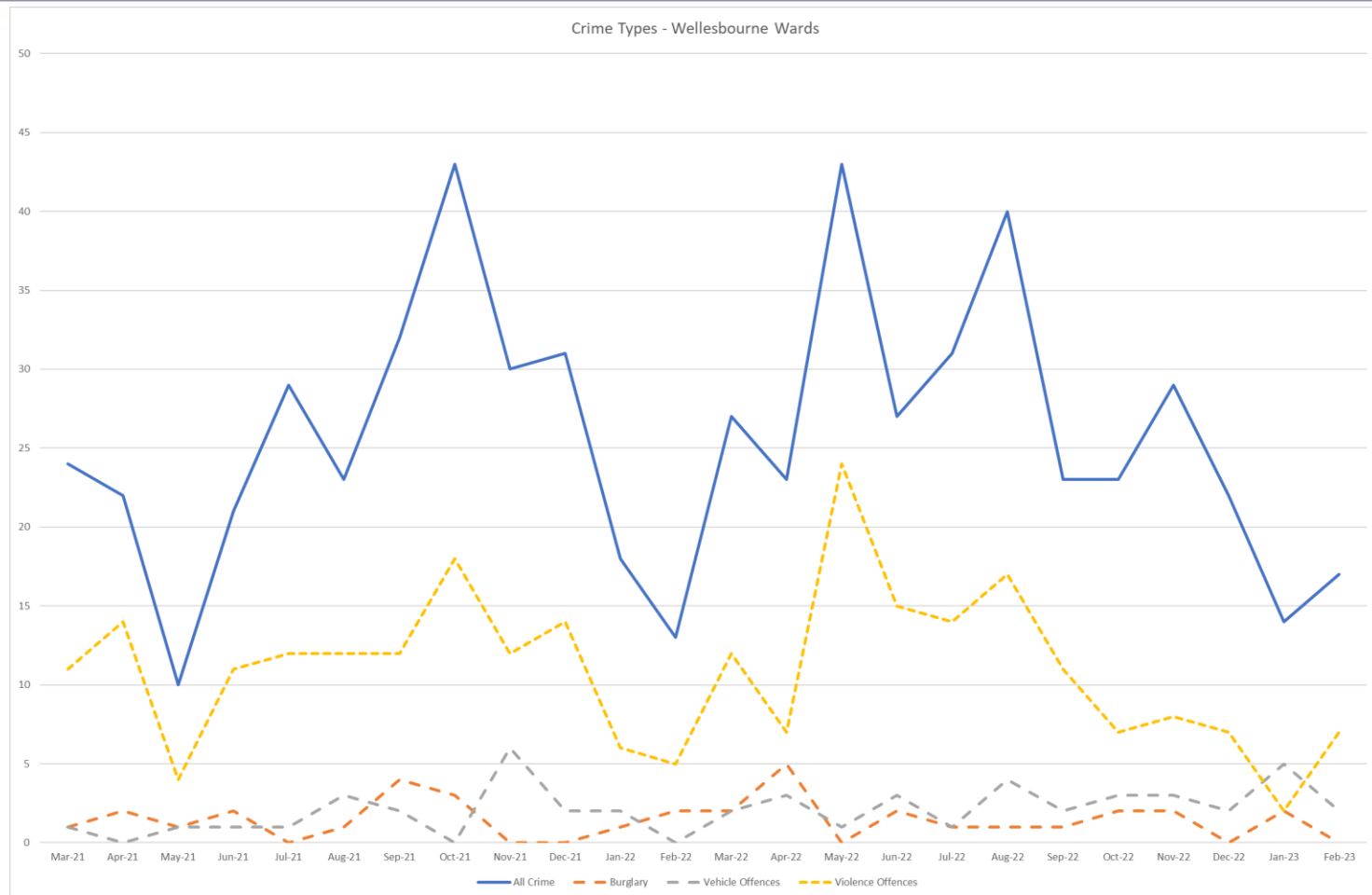
3. Vehicle Crime

Action- Offenders U/K but operation for prevention, including partnership work with Stratford District Council Rural Crime Advisors. Operation to be run at the services with multiple partner agencies, targeting this, vehicle defects, road safety, immigration offences, trading standards.

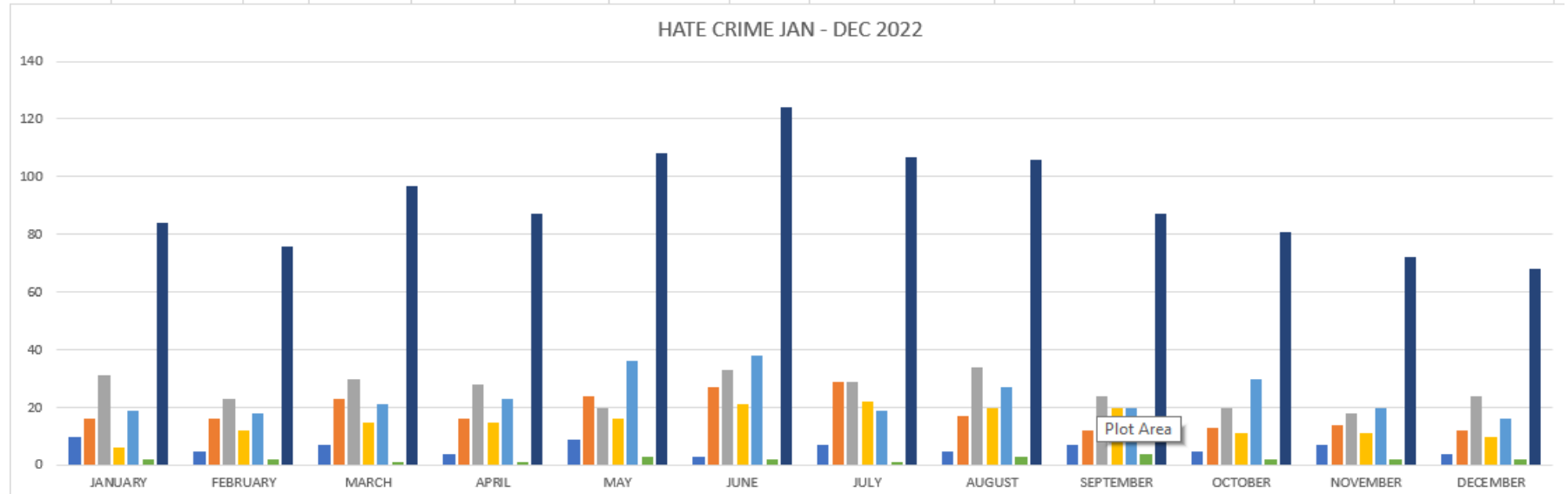
This table reflects comparable crimes recorded between Wellesbourne and Walton Ward and Stratford District as a whole over the last 12 months.

SNT - What's currently going on in Wellesbourne/Walton?

ASB – underpass area (ages 16+) – Occasional reports from members of the public about anti-social behaviour in and around the underpass area, including shouting and noise, possible cannabis use, graffiti. The underpass does have a reputation so fear of crime rather than crime itself is more prevalent here.

ASB – youth club (ages 12-15) – Recent issues at the Wellesbourne Youth Club at the Church Centre whereby some youths are refused entry due to behaviour displayed on previous occasions, and they then make an effort to disrupt the club, knock on houses nearby, and generally make a nuisance of themselves.

Refugees at Walton Hall – since Sept 2021 refugees from Afghanistan have been housed by the Home Office at Walton Hall. There are approx 70 individuals there currently.

What are we doing?

Continuing Hi-Viz patrols and promoting this on social media and monthly newsletter.

Regular follow-up visits following calls for service, engagement with victims of crime and offering support to victims of anti-social behaviour.

Engagement at regular events such as Rainbows and Youth Club, as well as occasionally dropping into coffee mornings and ad-hoc events to engage with residents and gather intelligence.

Engaging with partners – EVA carried out in September to look at the underpass, where the Parish Council wrote to co-op who agreed to install metal fencing around their border. Ongoing discussions with Highways/WCC about installing the same around the area they are responsible for around the underpass to improve road safety and deter gatherings. CCTV are aware of local concerns and have been proactively monitoring the area and linking in with SDC ASB Team and SNT weekly with any incidents of note.

Supporting Walton Hall – liaising with security personnel and hotel staff, working alongside the Home Office and County Council as necessary. Recently attended with Warwickshire Fire & Rescue with regards to an awareness presentation about fire safety and what to do during an evacuation.

Recruiting, training, and supporting Community Speed Watch group of volunteers who are having a good impact on vehicle speeds in the village and have received largely very positive feedback and praise.

Regularly linking in with Frankie in her capacity as Neighbourhood Watch co-ordinator for Wellesbourne and sharing information and intelligence to help combat crime and ASB.

What do we plan to do?

5x5x5 – as discussed at quarterly meeting in January. 5 locations, across 5 days, covering minimum 5k in areas deemed suitable by current trends, community tension, intelligence requirements. Wellesbourne is on the list for March.

Surgeries – although we do drop into events when commitments allow, we will be looking to hold engagement surgeries at various locations across the patch monthly (to include Wellesbourne), to give people the opportunity to discuss local issues/concerns with us.

Events – we hope to be invited to future events in the village including community days, fetes, xmas lights, etc to allow us to develop working relationships further and engage with the public.

PC Chris Taylor is our SNT lead on UE target hardening and has been working closely with our GTLO – Martin Rone-Clark to gain not only a really good working knowledge of dealing with these matters, but working hard to identify ways we can prevent trespassing and associated ASB that can accompany this type of issue. As your beat manager, I would expect you and the other local Parishes will gain the benefit of his expertise.

Good news stories March 2022 - March 2023

Ongoing – Support of Walton Hall and the CSW team.

March 2022 – supported the Warwickshire Road Safety Education and Active Travel team in delivering talks to local children and parents about road safety on bicycles, and then ran a bike marking event afterwards.

April 2022 – Introduced a quarterly meeting between SNT and the 17 parish councils (43 villages and hamlets in total) we cover on our area, plus the 7 district ward councillors and 2 county councillors. Feedback from Councillors involved has been positive.

May 2022 – We gave a talk and follow-up Q&A with residents from Ettington Lodge at their “Holiday at home” day which was well-received.

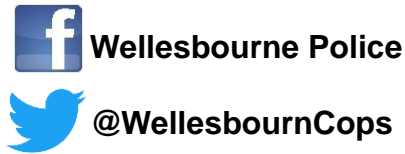
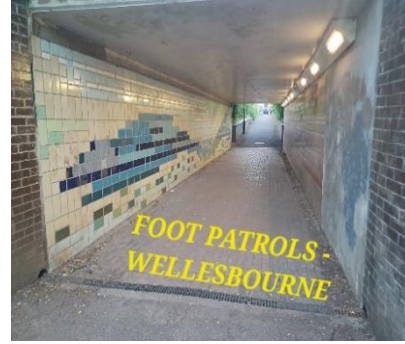
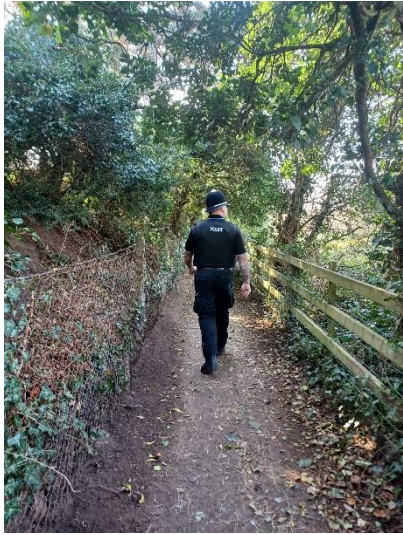
June 2022 – Warm Warwickshire Welcome event for refugees at Wellesbourne Village Hall, with the idea of building connections with those from Ukraine, Afghanistan, and Syria who have settled in the district.

September 2022 – Environmental Visual Audit of the underpass area alongside Warwickshire Fire & Rescue, Cllr Anne Prior, D/Cllr Anne Parry, as above.

November 2022 – Joint patrols with the Warwickshire Fire & Rescue following reports of small fires being lit around Wellesbourne.

February 2023 – Following a previous visit in October 2022, we visited the Wellesbourne Rainbows group along with OPU colleagues where they learned about police cars, police kits, and met a police dog. All feedback from the group, leaders, and parents was positive.

PREPARE/PREVENT
Being intelligence and information led, we can and should specifically target our community foot patrol in areas where it is most needed.

PROTECT
By deliberately targeting issues in locations, we can better address and promote the purpose of our activity or engagement, gaining better community support and confidence.

By formalising this process and recording it we can:

- Practically demonstrate NHPG targeted activity
- Demonstrate to the community that we are in the locations of, and looking at the issues they report
- We can also encourage an uplift in intelligence gathering - 5x5x5

5x days of targeted foot patrol across the month


- Beat managers to identify 5 areas for targeted foot patrol at the start of each month, using multiple data sources such as monthly crime statistics from AS&I, current beat priorities, intelligence, areas highlighted by PSPM and community feedback.
- Beat managers to record reason for each location selected on the returns form.
- Beat managers to submit their list of locations for each month to their sergeant.

5x locations across the SNT area

- Beat managers to identify 5 separate locations, along with dates the patrols will be performed.
- Teams to use 5x5x5 media material to promote the initiative across their area (not to promote dates/locations in advance in case details have to change).
- Promote across social media using '5x5x5' images, taking photos of patrols taking place

- Beat managers to complete return form, including:
- Total distance covered, number of intel logs submitted as result of patrols, number of KINs interacted with, number of incidents identified (e.g. team member comes across an insecure premises or vehicle, person in need, offence in progress etc).
